# LET'S SAIL SAFELY

### Random alcohol and drug use checks may be carried out even in the absence of any obvious signs of consumption.

(Decree No. 2025-50 of 15 January 2025 – Article R.4274-63 of the Transport Code)

#### WHO CAN BE CHECKED?

The boat operator and any crew member, for all types of boats: recreational, professional, or even those without a license.

### HOW DOES A CHECK TAKE PLACE?

- Alcohol and drug tests, just like on the road
- Random screenings
- Medical samples taken if needed

#### THRESHOLDS DURING CHECKS:

- 0.5 g/L of blood or 0.25 mg/L of exhaled air
- From 0.8 g/L of blood or 0.4 mg/L of exhaled air: serious offense
- Drugs: zero tolerance

## SANCTIONS AND GOOD CONDUCT ADVICE



### SANCTIONS

### **IMMEDIATE SANCTIONS**\*

• Immobilisation of the boat, detention and temporary suspension, for a maximum period of one year, of the operating license or the crew member's qualification certificate

### **CRIMINAL SANCTIONS\*\***

- Suspension of the operating license or certificate for up to three years
- Two years' imprisonment and a €4,500 fine (three years if transporting dangerous goods)
- Permanent withdrawal of the operating license or certificate
- Additional penalties: community service, prohibition from applying for an operating license



Refusing to undergo a check is an offense and carries the same penalties as testing positive for alcohol or drugs.

### SAIL RESPONSIBLY

To sail safely, you must be fully alert:

- Check your condition before taking the helm
- Avoid any consumption before and during navigation
